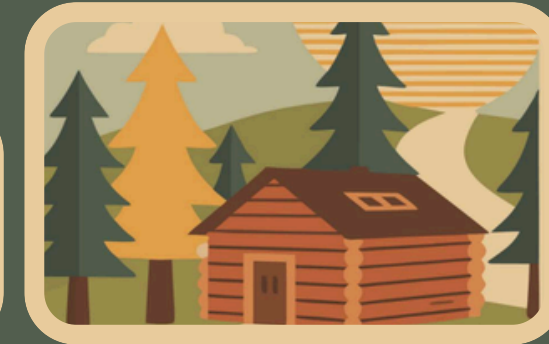

All items need to be clean and gently used. Henderson Settlement is located in Bell County, KY and has a long history of affiliation with the United Methodist Church and United Women in Faith.

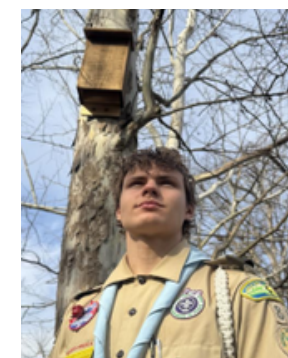
EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT

Central Member - Blake Messler

Ten bat homes were installed throughout Alcoa's Springbrook Park as the result of an Eagle Project by Blake Messler, Junior Assistant Scoutmaster of Troop 81 in Maryville. Our local bat population, the Little Brown Bat, will benefit from this project. These little insectivores offer natural pest-control for harmful insects like mosquitoes, allowing park goers an enjoyable experience.

"Bats are an important component of a healthy ecosystem. A female bat can consume 4500-8000 insects in one night," Blake explains. "The bat boxes will provide effective protection from elements and predators as well as optimal locations to raise pups."

Blake was fortunate to obtain three generous sponsors from the community. In a woodworking shop, he prepared 10 bat box kits from partially donated lumber. He then led his Troop members as they assembled each of the new bat homes. Way to go, Blake!
